We have seen some amazing learning this term - Y2 have loved designing and making their bread which I got to taste this afternoon. It was so hard to choose the best flavour as the children had been so inventive with their recipes. There was bread made with banana and honey, and even chocolate bread!

Nursery


Year 2

But most excitingly, we've begun to build our own model of a Celtic Roundhouse, which has involved some woodwork and hot glue gun-use! We can't wait to see how they turn out next week!



Year 4

In science this week, Year 4 continued to investigate sound. Using an instrument, they made a sound and recorded the volume using a decibel reader. They continued to repeat this, but adding another layer of material over the microphone to see if the thickness of material would impact the volume of the sound made...

I wonder what loud sounds they could measure at home... is there a way they could muffle them using their learning from today?




Year 5

Hello to all in the extended year 5 family. I'm constantly amazed by this class - this week is no exception. We finished our newspaper reports to such a high standard, so high I spent the afternoon showing them off to other staff.

We completed our science experiments and found that water and oxygen react with the iron in metal to create a new substance - Iron oxide.

We have also nearly completed our terms maths, looking at calculating using decimals. Home Learning is on Classroom and due by Thursday next week. Home Learning club will be open, on Thursday, for those wishing to use school tech and catch up.
