This week has been Science Week. Reception have been very busy being scientists and carrying out experiments. We worked together using different variables to discover the best way to free a whale frozen in ice, have explored changing states by making and feeling cornflour gloop, and have discussed reactions with our bicarb and vinegar dinosaur volcanoes! The children have used amazing vocabulary to make predictions, test them and discuss our conclusions. What an exciting week of learning and fun!

Year 1 and Year 2


Year 1 and Year 2 have joined forces this week exploring time and proving or disproving ‘Bigger people are faster’
 They have planned their experiment, written predictions and then carried out their experiment on Wednesday.
 As you can see they really enjoyed racing each other to find out if Bigger people are faster!





Year 3

This week, Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed National Science Week by investigating whether 'the harder we work, the faster things go'. The children have planned and carried out their own investigations to test their hypotheses, which involved exercising at different intensities and measuring heart rates! We've also completed our diary writing unit on Flat Stanley, which the children have worked really hard on!



Year 4

Thank you science week - it's been fun! It's true what they've been investigating in Year 5 and 6 - times really does fly when you are having fun! A slight change to our prove it statement: The harder we work; the faster things go.





Year 5

Hello to all, this week, science week, was amazing. The children explored the statement 'Time flies when you're having fun.' and created experiments to prove or disprove this. They worked as scientists all week and came up with hypotheses based on research (did you know dopamine speeds up your internal clock?) and carried out a series of experiments to try and prove this. Additionally, we went to the University of Plymouth to look at the mechanics of the human body and the ways in which the heart can be slowed and sped up through exercise and rest.

Staying Safe and Well - Strengthening Family Relationships

Incredible Years is a programme designed specifically for parents and carers with babies to pre-teens. The courses are run during the day so that parents and carers can attend whilst their children are at nursery or school. The aim is to encourage children to engage in positive behaviours. There is also a course for parents and carers of young children (2-5 years old) with a diagnosis of ASC and language delay.



Strengthening Families is designed for parents and carers who have children aged between 10 and 14 years old. The sessions are run in the evenings so that parents and children can attend together. The aim is for parents/carers and children to have focussed space together to support positive family relationships and manage challenging behaviours.

Family Matters is a charitable organisation which offers families a supported space to talk about their concerns and find a way to move forward together. Families can [self refer](#) to the family therapy sessions by completing the form. The service is run locally from their building in Stoke Village.

Family and Community Solutions is an organisation which offers:

- Mediation between a parent and young person. This involves a space to talk through any difficulties with an independent person. This is designed to help the parent and young person rebuild their relationship.
- Family Group Conference between a child/young person and their family support network. This is where all the key adults in a child's family can come together and agree a plan of how they are going to work together to best support their child or young person.
